
The 12th North American Forest Ecology Workshop (NAFEW) will celebrate 25 years of bringing together diverse stakeholders from across Canada, Mexico, and the United States, including forest ecologists, silviculturists, wildlife biologists, and other forest researchers when it convenes in Flagstaff, Arizona, USA, in 2019. The workshop, with an expected attendance of more than 200 participants, creates an important opportunity for the exchange and advancement of knowledge related to basic and applied research in forest ecosystems within North America. The workshop helps fos-

ter dialogue and discussions towards improved understanding and sustainable management of forested landscapes.

The theme of the 2019 workshop, ***Forests on the edge: forest ecology in rapidly changing conditions***, reflects the growing concerns about all North American forests in a changing world. This challenge is prominently on display in the southwestern United States, where forests and woodlands are experiencing rapid changes and widespread increases in tree mortality. For example, pinyon pine mortality approaching 90% has been documented at sites in Arizona.



The workshop will be held at Little America Hotel, which sits on a 500-acre private forest, and provides ready access to downtown Flagstaff, Arizona. In the heart of the southwestern United States, Flagstaff offers exceptional cultural and recreational opportunities as a gateway to Grand Canyon and other stunning national parks, monuments, and forests.
